Second Career provides financial support to help laid-off Ontarians participate in training for a new career. An Employment Consultant can help you take the first step.



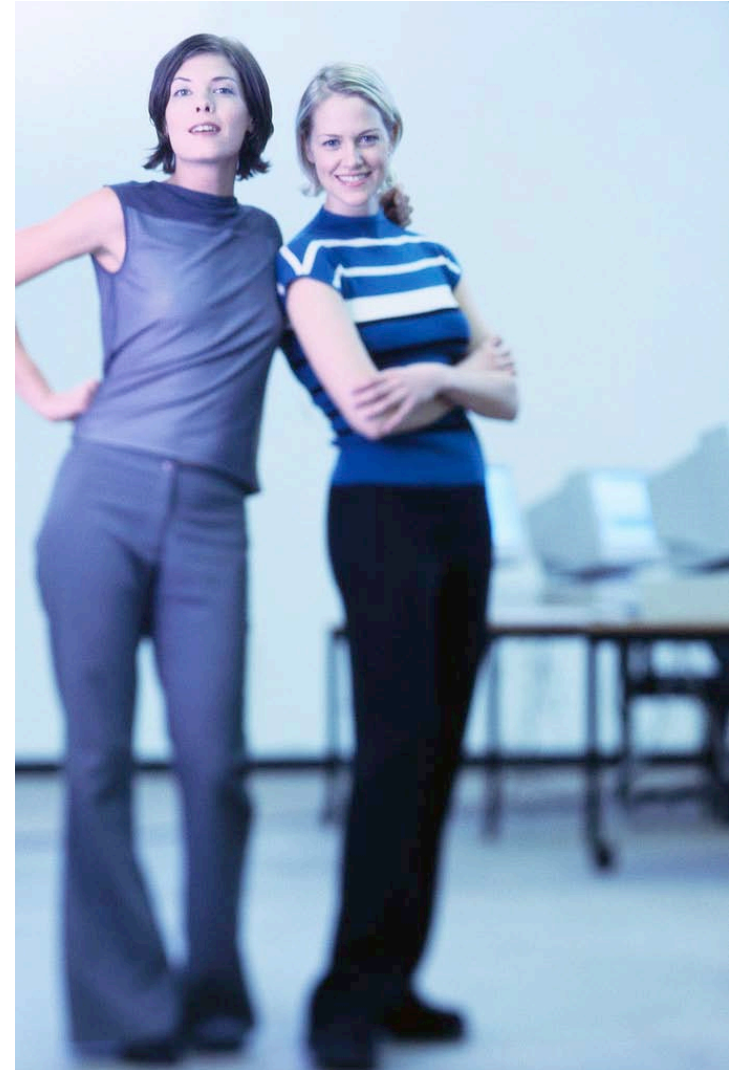
Who Can Apply?



If you were laid off since January 1, 2005, you may be eligible to apply for Second Career.

Laid off workers include those individuals who have taken an interim job to make ends meet.

The definition of an “interim job” is a entry level job making less than \$423/week.

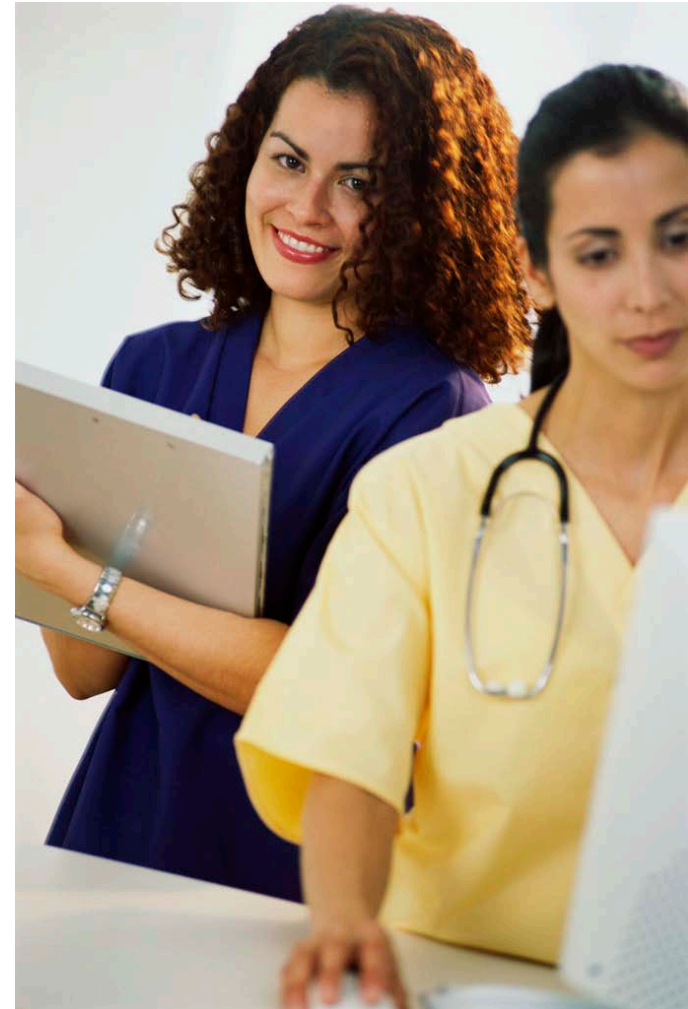


Eligibility Requirements Continued

Full time students and new graduates are not eligible for Second Career

Second Career training must lead to a certificate or diploma from a private or community college

*** Please note University training is not funded



The next steps...

- Meet with an Employment Consultant and work on your Second Career application
- Complete your application
- Submit your application to the MTCU for approval
- If approved - begin training for your new career!



What kind of support is available?



Second Career provides up to \$28,000 to support tuition, travel, books and other training-related costs. Additional funds may be available to people with disabilities, and for people who need help to pay for academic upgrading, the cost of living away from home and child care.



Suitability Requirements



The Employment Consultant will ask you about:

- Your work history
- Your education and training
- Your job search
- Educational background
